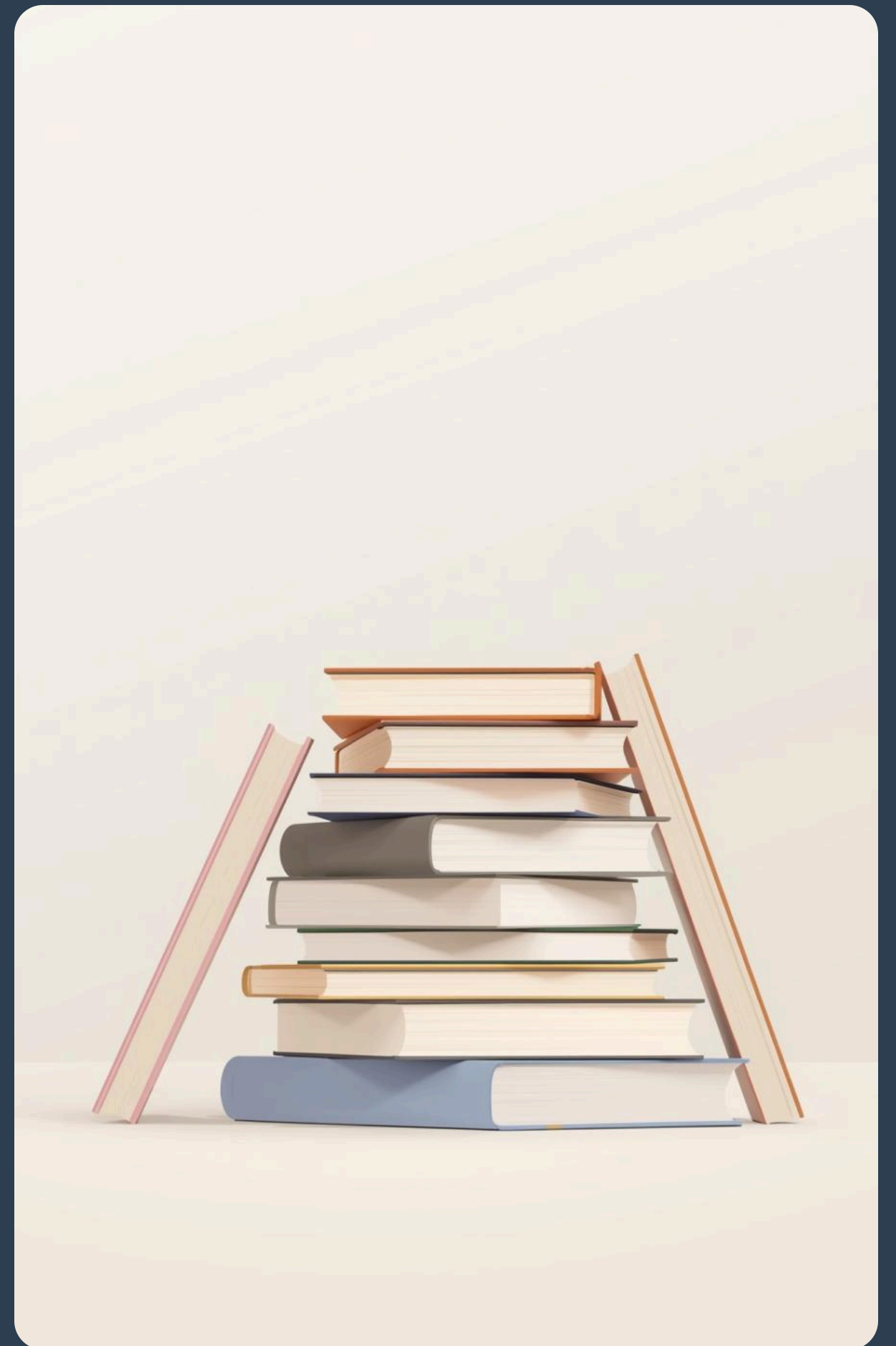
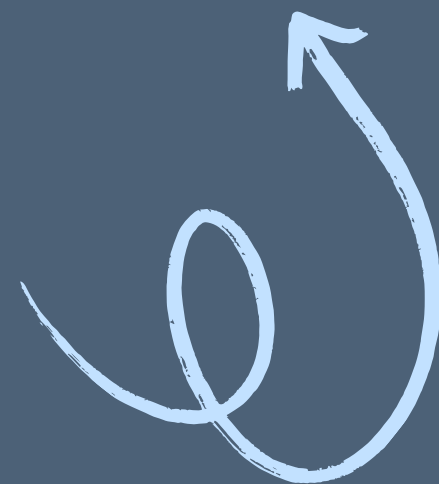

Types of Literature Reviews

Understanding the different review approaches

Narrative Review

A narrative review offers a **qualitative summary** of existing literature, emphasizing thematic insights and broader scholarly contexts, while allowing for subjective interpretation of findings.

Systematic Review

A systematic review employs a **structured methodology** to comprehensively analyze literature, minimizing bias by following predefined protocols for selecting and evaluating relevant studies.

Meta-Analysis

Meta-analysis quantitatively combines data from multiple studies, providing a **statistical overview** that enhances the understanding of research outcomes and their significance within a specific field.

Introduction Section

This section outlines the research topic, establishes clear objectives, and defines the **scope and boundaries** to ensure focused and relevant literature review within the specified field.

Thematic

Grouping by key themes enhances understanding.

02

Chronological

Following historical development shows progression effectively.

03

Methodological

Based on research methods clarifies approaches used.

Critical Analysis and Synthesis



01

Evaluate Critically

Critical evaluation of methodologies allows researchers to assess the **validity and reliability** of findings, ensuring that conclusions derived from studies are well-founded and robust.

Identify Contradictions

Define Question

Search Databases
